The above-named individual has Type 1 diabetes and relies on a medical device that must **not** be exposed to electrical screening equipment, including X-ray machines or full-body airport scanners. Manual inspection is therefore required.

While travelling, they are also required to always carry essential medical supplies and monitoring equipment to safely manage their condition, including but not limited to:

- Insulin Pump consumables
- Continuous Glucose Monitoring system (CGMs) consumables
- Insulin vials, pens, and cartridges
- Insulin pen needles and lancets
- Blood glucose testing meter and associated equipment
- Glucose tablets and fast-acting carbohydrate foods for the treatment of hypoglycaemia (this may include sweets & sugary drinks)

The above must **not** be put in the hold where it may freeze.
